"This session will attempt to bridge the gap between what parents and kids know about sex, drugs and relationships in an attempt to help parents maintain open communication with their child and better help them navigate this transitional time of adolescent development."

Sabrina grew up in Fort St John and moved away after graduating from high school. Sabrina worked in the school system for almost 20 years, working in
